GP's should contact GP Liaison Nurse if you have concerns regarding a patient you are referring, or any patient who has already attended the A&E Department. **The GPLN will provide a link to an A&E Doctor if necessary.**

Ophthalmology Services in the Royal Victoria Eye and Ear Hospital

Ophthalmology A+E Hours of Service: MONDAY TO FRIDAY – 9a.m. to 5p.m

24 hour, 7 days a week, acute emergency service. In the case of out of hours attendances please phone the department prior to attending.

Non-emergency referrals need to be directed by fax or mail ONLY to the OPD Department so a timely appointment can be arranged.

The Ophthalmic A/E Department in RVEEH provides a service for patients with emergencies or acute eye problems. Patients are advised to attend their GP for initial assessment who can then refer them in if necessary.

After 5 pm there is an on call team available to see genuine emergencies only and it is advisable to first ring to discuss cases. The on call doctor can give advice regarding the most appropriate care pathway for the patient.

Please use the designated RVEEH referral forms, available to download on the website. Patients should not be advised to hand deliver the letters or to hand them in to A/E as this does not expediate their appropriate OPD appointment and only leads to increased waiting times for patients with genuine acute eye problems. ENT A+E Hours of Service: MONDAY TO FRIDAY – 9a.m. to 4p.m.

NO SERVICE AT WEEKENDS OR BANK HOLIDAYS - patients must be referred to nearest General Hospital.

Please refer all Non-emergency referrals by fax or mail ONLY to the OPD Department so a timely appointment can be arranged.

Childrens' services: Children requiring urgent intervention and all children aged 3 and under should be referred to paediatric Hospital.

Audiology Service: Not available via A/E (Except in sudden sensory neural hearing loss).

Ear Syringing/irrigation: Access to Irrigation Clinic, via A&E but GP should advise softening of wax with olive oil for several days before referral. Ear Syringing /Irrigation Courses for GP Nurses held at RVEEH for details or email elspeth.finlay@rveeh.ie

Micro suction: Micro suction for patients who are unsuitable for ear syringing is available. Access is via A+E only. Direct access via GP is planned for the future.

OUT-PATIENT APPOINTMENT PROCESS

1. **OPD REFERRAL LETTERS:** PLEASE POST OR FAX REFERRAL LETTERS TO OPD
OPD REFERRAL LETTERS CANNOT BE HAND DELIVERED BY PATIENT.
Referral templates are available at rveeh.ie for download. A separate template for each speciality
2. LETTER SHOULD BE **LEGIBLE** AND DETAILED – Please ensure that name, address, D.O.B and contact telephone numbers are included.
3. Please include the following:
 - FULL DETAILS OF PATIENTS CONDITION
 - LIST OF MEDICATIONS
 - PAST RELEVANT MEDICAL HISTORY
 - PREVIOUS ATTENDANCE AT EYE AND EAR AND WHICH CONSULTANT.
 - PATIENT DETAILS WILL BE ENTERED ON HOSPITAL DATA BASE.
4. YOUR REFERRAL LETTER WILL BE ASSESSED – All referral letters are assessed by a member of the medical team / Consultant and a category of urgency is applied depending on the level of information stated on the letter. Please make sure that all relevant detail is stated on the letter. The instruction is then given to the appointments staff to make the most appropriate appointment for the patient.

ROUTINE APPOINTMENT WAIT TIME 12 months for Ophthalmology and up to 18 months for ENT.
GPs should mark letter **URGENT / SOON OR ROUTINE**

PLEASE REMEMBER: WE CANNOT GIVE APPOINTMENTS TO YOU OR YOUR PATIENTS
OVER THE PHONE - unless they are return patients.
WE CANNOT ARRANGE APPOINTMENTS FOR PRIVATE PATIENTS.

- ✓ PATIENTS MUST ATTEND FOR THEIR APPOINTMENT ON TIME.
- ✓ IF A PATIENT FAILS TO ATTEND A CLINIC THEY WILL NOT BE RE-APPOINTED AUTOMATICALLY- Our DNA policy allows for a max of two consecutive D.N.A's and then the patient will be discharged from our service.
- ✓ **NON ATTENDEES** ARE A **MAJOR PROBLEM**. PLEASE ADVISE YOUR PATIENTS TO CONTACT US IF THEY NO LONGER WANT THEIR APPOINTMENT.
- ✓ IF PATIENTS HAVE TO CANCEL AND RE-SCHEDULE THEY WILL HAVE TO WAIT FOR THE NEXT AVAILABLE SLOT.

GP REFERRAL TO CLINICAL NURSE SPECIALIST CHALAZION CLINIC

A chalazion is a condition in which an obstructed meibomian gland causes a granuloma within the tarsal plate.

Symptoms

Acute or chronic eyelid lump. Swelling, pain, tenderness, erythema of eyelid.

Signs

Visible or palpable well-defined subcutaneous nodule in the eyelid.

Treatment

If associated with blepharitis instruct patient re lid hygiene.

Warm compress to eyelid with massage three times a day.

Fucidic Acid 1% drops B.D. for one week or alternatively Chloromycetin BD for one week.

If the chalazion has not resolved two weeks after completing treatment patient may be referred for incision and curettage.

Referral

Suitable patients to be referred to CNS chalazion clinic in A&E dept.

Contact GP Liaison Nurse and fax in referral letter.

Patient will be contacted with appointment.

If not suitable for CNS clinic – refer to OPD as usual.

Eligibility

The following referrals will **not** be accepted in the CNS chalazion clinic:

- Patients on Warfarin, Aspirin or Plavix.
- Patients under 16 years of age.
- Recurrent chalazia at the same site.
- Chalazion in close proximity of the tear duct.
- Chalaxion on the lid margin.
- Ulcerated lid lesions.
- Lesions outside the lid area.



The role of the Cancer Nurse Co-ordinator Royal Victoria Eye and Ear Hospital

1. To provide information, advice & support to patients and their families from the time of diagnosis.
2. The point of contact within the hospital for patients. The Cancer Nurse Co-ordinator is a resource and contact for the primary care team.
3. If GPs have queries about any patients or wish to fast track a patient who they may think is positive for a malignancy they can contact the co-ordinator.
4. GPs should continue to refer patients to the RVEEH as usual; the co-ordinator is only available for high-risk cases.
5. Co-ordinate transfer of patients to other hospitals e.g., St. Luke's. Ensure all information is received to and from other hospitals, track patients. Formulate discharge plans.
6. The Cancer nurse Co-ordinators can inform GPs (by phone or by letter) of their patient's discharge and the treatment/procedures which they have undergone.
7. Ensure patients received OPD appointments for follow-up after Radiotherapy or Chemotherapy is completed.
8. The Cancer Nurse Co-ordinators ensures that primary care services are in place when patients are discharged from hospital.
9. I have the responsibility for two sites. RVEEH and SVUH.

OCULAR ONCOLOGY SERVICE ROYAL VICTORIA EYE AND EAR HOSPITAL

New Service:

The Ocular Oncology Clinic is a new service that is now available in Ireland. The Ocular Oncology Clinic was set up here in the RVEEH by Mr. Noel Horgan Cons Retinal & Oncology Ophthalmic Surgeon & assisted by Dr. Moya Cunningham Cons Radiation Oncologist (SLH) in June 2010.

Patients are referred to Mr. Noel Horgan (RVEEH) via Ophthalmologists & Opticians throughout the country, to investigate a freckle / mole that has been noticed at the front or back of the eye. In many cases these moles are benign but a small number of these moles may also be a malignant (cancerous) melanoma.

Investigations:

All patients that are referred to the clinic receive a thorough eye examination. Patients **may** have a series of photographs and scans to the eye in which may take up to 4 hours to complete. Patients who are coming to the Ocular Oncology Clinic are advised to take a friend or relative to accompany them, as both eyes may need to be dilated. If this is the case the patient's vision will be blurred for approx 4-6hrs & driving is **not** advised.

Ocular Melanoma:

Melanoma is a malignant tumour that most often arises from a freckle or mole on the skin. Less commonly is it found in the eye or other sites of the body. Melanoma typically occurs in fair skinned, blue or green eyed individuals & carries the potential to spread to other parts of the body such as the liver & lungs. The exact cause of ocular (eye) melanoma is unknown. Ocular melanoma almost always affects one eye & it is not thought to be hereditary. It can develop in an otherwise healthy individual. Ocular melanoma is a very rare type of cancer affecting approx 50 people per year in Ireland.



Treatment:

Plaque Radiotherapy:

- New treatment available in Ireland that is suitable for **some** ocular melanomas.
- The radioactive plaque is a concave / saucer shaped disc made from pure silver or gold plated, that is impregnated with Ruthenium 106 (beta emitter) or Iodine Seeds (ISO Seeds) within the dome of the disk.
- Measures approx 1mm in thickness
- The disk is surgically implanted at the site of the tumour by Mr. Noel Horgan (RVEEH)
- The plaque disk emits radiation constantly while in place on the surface of the eye ball. This allows a high dose of radiation to be delivered to the tumour.
- Surgery is carried out in St. Lukes Hospital Rathgar.
- The plaque disk stays around the eye for a number of days, of which it is then surgically removed. The patient is required to stay in hospital while the plaque is in place.
- Some tumours may be unsuitable for this type of treatment & the patient may be referred to St. Paul's Eye Unit at the Royal Liverpool & Broadgreen University Hospital, Liverpool for alternative treatment that is not currently available in Ireland.
- If the tumour is too big to treat with radiotherapy, the eye may **need** to be removed (enucleation)

HSE PRIMARY AND COMMUNITY CARE - AUDIOLOGY SERVICE

INTRODUCTION

The objective of the Audiology service is to provide people with a hearing impairment with amplification devices, advice and information to enable them to overcome or reduce the effects of their hearing impairment.

REFERRALS

a) Adults

Eligibility for the adult service is restricted to those who hold medical cards. Referrals are received from medical practitioners and it is essential that each patient should receive a full medical examination prior to being referred. In either case, the referral to the hearing service should be especially for the fitting of the hearing aid. It is not the policy to accept referrals for other types of Audiological assessment or for legal purposes.

In the case of students who are attending third level education they retain their eligibility provided that they have Student ID card or proof of eligibility.

b) Children

The Audiology service for children is available to all regardless of financial circumstances. All children are eligible for this service from birth until they complete their full-time education. Parental consent is necessary before a child is referred to the Audiology Service. Referrals are accepted from medical practitioners and children should have had a medical examination prior to being referred to the service.

SERVICE PROVIDED

- ❑ Hearing test
- ❑ Fitting of hearing Aid
- ❑ Review in order to ensure that they are coping well with the hearing aid and benefiting from it. In the case of children this also includes monitoring the progress of speech and language and school progress.

OUTREACH CLINICS

Outreach clinics may take place in hospitals, nursing homes, old people center's and in the patient's home. It is the policy of the National Audiology Service to provide outreach clinics where the person with the hearing impairment is unable to attend an Audiology centre. The request for the visit should come from a medical practitioner who can certify that the person has a disability that prevents them from attending the Audiology centre. In the case of elderly people in long-term care, a request from the medical officer is sufficient. Where a visit to the patient's home is requested, a standard form should be completed including details of how to locate the home of the patient.
